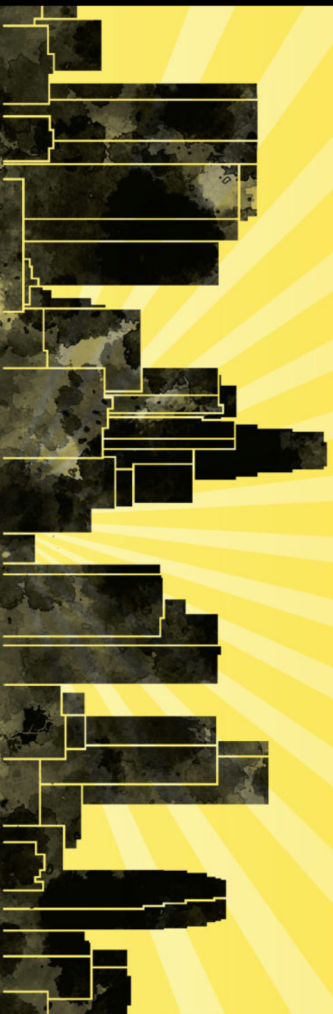

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

WHEN INTERACTING WITH IMMIGRATION OFFICERS (ICE)

- **If you believe you are witnessing ICE activity**, please call ICIRR's 24-Hour Family Support Hotline at 1-855-HELP-MY-FAMILY (1-855-435-7693).
- **If you find yourself interacting with an ICE officer in any location including your workplace, or out in the community, remember:**
 - You have the right to remain silent when questioned or arrested by immigration officers
 - You should remain calm and keep your hands where the officer can see them.
 - You can state that you wish to speak with an attorney.
 - **You are not required to**
 - Discuss your immigration or citizenship status with the police, immigration agents, or other officials
 - Sign anything you do not understand.
- **If an officer knocks on your door at home:**
 - You have the right to not open the door.
 - ICE officers must have a **warrant signed by a judge** to enter your home. ICE "warrants" are not signed by judges; they are ICE forms signed by ICE officers and they do not grant authority to enter your home without your consent
- **If you are outdoors and think you see immigration officers nearby:**
 - You can move to a safe indoor space
 - If you are a U.S. citizen and feel safe to do so, you can record the activity with your phone or write down any relevant information about what you witness—ALWAYS being careful to not interfere or otherwise obstruct the operation
 - **DO NOT:**
 - Post unverified information on social media
 - Interfere with the investigation or otherwise put yourself in harm's way

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

WHEN INTERACTING WITH IMMIGRATION OFFICERS (ICE)

Establish a safety plan that your family can use if ICE arrests you. Key parts of a safety plan include:

- Identify your emergency contacts and memorize their phone numbers.
- Provide your child's school or daycare with an emergency contact to pick up your child.
- Provide authorization in writing for your emergency contact to make medical and legal decisions for your child.
- Tell your loved ones that if you are detained by ICE, they can try to use ICE's online detainee locator to find you: locator.ice.gov
- Carry your valid immigration documents. If you do not have such documents, carry copies of documents that show that you have been in the US for at least two years (if that is the case). Examples include housing, employment, or education records
- If you are detained, it is important that you seek legal representation.

CONOZCA SUS DERECHOS CUANDO INTERACTÚE CON AGENTES DE INMIGRACIÓN (ICE)

- **Si cree que es testigo de una actividad de ICE**, llame a la línea directa de apoyo familiar de 24 horas de ICIRR al 1-855-HELP-MY-FAMILY (1-855-435-7693).
- **Si usted se encuentra interactuando con un oficial de ICE en cualquier lugar, incluyendo su lugar de trabajo, o en la comunidad, recuerde:**
 - Tiene derecho a permanecer en silencio cuando sea interrogado o arrestado por los oficiales de inmigración
 - Debe permanecer tranquilo y mantener sus manos donde el oficial pueda verlas
 - Puede indicarles que usted desea hablar con un abogado
 - **NO está obligado a:**
 - Compartir su estatus de inmigración o de ciudadanía con la policía, agentes de inmigración u otros funcionarios
 - Firmar nada que no entienda.
- **Si un agente toca la puerta de su casa:**
 - Usted tiene el derecho de no abrir la puerta.
 - Los agentes de ICE deben de tener una **orden firmada por un juez** para entrar a su casa. Las “órdenes” de ICE no están firmadas por jueces; son formularios de ICE firmados por oficiales de ICE y no dan autoridad para que ellos entren a su casa sin su permiso
- **Si está fuera de casa y cree ver agentes de inmigración cerca:**
 - Puede Entrar al interior de un lugar seguro
 - Si usted es ciudadano estadounidense y se siente seguro de hacerlo, puede grabar la actividad con su teléfono o escriba cualquier información relevante sobre lo que vea, teniendo siempre cuidado de no interferir u obstruir de otro modo la operación.
 - **NO:**
 - Publique información no verificada en las redes sociales
 - Interfiera en la investigación o se ponga en peligro de otro modo



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CONOZCA SUS DERECHOS CUANDO INTERACTÚE CON AGENTES DE INMIGRACIÓN (ICE)

Establezca un plan de seguridad que su familia pueda utilizar si ICE lo detiene. Las partes clave de un plan de seguridad incluyen:

- Identifique sus contactos de emergencia y memorice sus números de teléfono.
- Proporcione a la escuela o guardería de su hijo un contacto de emergencia para recoger a su hijo.
- Autorice por escrito a su contacto de emergencia para que tome decisiones médicas y legales sobre su hijo.
- Dígale a sus seres queridos que si usted es detenido por ICE, pueden intentar utilizar el localizador de detenidos en línea de ICE para encontrarlo: locator.ice.gov
- Lleve con usted sus documentos migratorios válidos. Si no tiene dichos documentos, lleve copias de documentos que demuestren que ha estado en los EE. UU. durante al menos dos años (si ese es el caso). Los ejemplos incluyen vivienda, empleo o registros educativos.
- Si usted es detenido, es importante que busque representación legal.
 - Llame al 1-855-435-7693 para ponerse en contacto con un abogado de inmigración.

S

SIZE AND STRENGTH - It's critical to report how many ICE or federal agents and vehicles you see. If there are different law enforcement agencies or local police, note the number of agents and agencies involved.

A

ACTIVITY AND ACTION - What is happening? A traffic stop? Is ICE targeting specific individuals? Are ICE vehicles circling a school? The more information, the better.

L

LOCATION - Where did you see ICE? At a school or local business? At someone's house? Take note of the cross streets and if ICE is going in a specific direction.

U

UNIFORM - Specify what agents are wearing. Are they wearing civilian clothing, uniforms, or vests? Masks, face coverings, hats, shades, or anything else concealing their identity? What do any badges or vests say?

T

TIME AND DATE - One of the most critical pieces of information to note when reporting or posting about ICE sightings is the time and date ICE was spotted.

E

EQUIPMENT AND WEAPONS - Are ICE agents carrying weapons? Identify any equipment agents have (including guns, tear gas, pepper spray, or other weapons) and whether they use them on people.

You have the right to film activity in public spaces. Record at a safe distance and explain what is happening. Remember, report ICE sightings by calling our Family Support Network Hotline at [855-435-7693](tel:855-435-7693)



Disability Accommodations Card

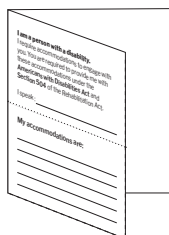
Instructions

Cut out and fold card as show below. The front of the card says you are an individual who requires a disability. The back side of the card is where you can write out the accommodation or accommodations you require. You can also write the language that you speak if it is other than English. For example, if you require an accommodation of needing a American Sign Language interpreter, you can write your accommodation as “American Sign Language Interpreter”. Please write or have someone else write out the accommodation(s) you require in the English language. Carry this card with you or near you. If you require an aide, you can have your aide carry this card on your behalf.

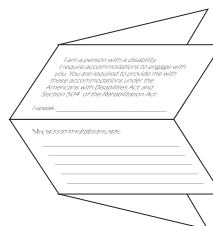
